Georgia Alligator Hunting Season Summary 2020 (Preliminary Report 10/8/2020)

During the 2020 alligator hunting season in Georgia, 1,030 permits were issued (including 30 new permits for additional hunting opportunity at Fort Stewart), and 372 alligators were harvested. This is the most alligators ever harvested and 98 more than the previous 5-year average. Successful hunters averaged 3.0 days spent hunting, and used an average of 2.11 assistants during their trips. Data on length of harvested alligators and popular hunting locations are shown in the tables below.
