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> Jekyll Clam Creek Beach Advisory Lifted; Jekyll St. Andrews Beach Placed Under Advisory

GLYNN COUNTY, GA – The Glynn County Health Department has lifted the swimming advisory for Clam Creek Beach on Jekyll Island (from Clam Creek to the old north picnic area). And advisory has been issued for Jekyll St. Andrews Beach (from Macy Lane to St. Andrews picnic area).

Routine water quality tests from samples taken November 1 show the beach water at St. Andrews on Jekyll contains a high level of enterococci bacteria, which increase the risk of gastrointestinal illness in swimmers. Bacterial levels for Clam Creek Beach on Jekyll have dropped below Environmental Protection Agency's recommended limits. Therefore, the advisory for that beach has been lifted.

The Glynn County Health Department recommends you do not swim or wade in the water in the area under advisory. Fish and other seafood caught from these areas should be thoroughly washed with fresh water and thoroughly cooked before eating.

The area will be retested and the advisory will be lifted when tests show the bacteria levels meet the Environmental Protection Agency's recommended standards.

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
