

## How HPD Can Help Your Community

The Historic Preservation Division collaborates with federal agencies to comply with environmental review requirements, administers economic incentive programs, and promotes a community-wide understanding of the value of historic buildings, neighborhoods, and heritage.

#### Who are we?

The Historic Preservation Division is Georgia's state historic preservation office. Our mission is to promote the preservation and use of historic places for a better Georgia. Our goals are to preserve historic resources and build a preservation ethic among all Georgians.

## Why Preserve?

Historic and archaeological resources are tangible evidence of our past. Throughout Georgia, communities use historic preservation as a tool for planning, community revitalization, and economic development. Preservation activities result in historic sites gaining recognition for their significance and being returned to active use within their communities





### Archaeology

- *Identify and protect* archaeological resources on land owned by the Dept. of Natural Resources.
- Assist with planning and policy making, with allied organizations in the preservation fields, to benefit ecological resources.
- Provide public education, technical advice, and educational opportunities related to archaeology.



### **Outreach Programs**

- Certified Local Governments receive technical assistance and qualify for grants through a federal partnership program.
- African American Programs provide assistance and information to anyone interested in preserving African American historic resources.
- Centennial Farm Program honors farms for their contributions to our agricultural heritage and encourages preservation of agricultural resources.



#### **Historic Resources**

- Environmental Review and Compliance provides
   a framework to balance historic preservation
   values with the needs of federally or state sponsored projects (road construction, cell
   towers, etc.). HPD's role in this process is
   advisory, with a final determination of project
   implementation made by federal or state
   agencies.
- Historic Resources Surveys allow cities to identify and document existing historic properties — an essential first step in preservation planning.
- National and Georgia Registers of Historic Places
  provide recognition of significant properties,
  identify historic properties for government
  planning purposes, and encourage preservation
  through public awareness and preservation
  incentives.
- State and Federal Grants are available to local governments and nonprofit organizations for preservation planning and to projects that aid in the preservation of historic properties.
- State and Federal Tax Incentives are available to property owners to encourage the adaptive use of historic buildings and the revitalization of historic neighborhoods and commercial areas.
