
This historical park features a log fort built in 1792 by settlers for protection against Creek and Cherokee Indians. Located between Atlanta and Athens, Fort Yargo offers a fun camping, hiking and fishing experience for families. The park surrounds Marbury Creek Reservoir, a 260-acre lake with a swimming beach, fishing areas and boat ramps. Many campsites and yurts are near the water's edge, and hiking/biking trails follow the lake shore. Camp Twin Lakes is an accessible facility located inside the park which is designed for challenged populations but closed to the public; for more information call 770-867-6123.

Campground Rules

- 1. Register before setting up, then set up camping units immediately. All sites may be reserved. All tents must be on gravel pad. Set up in designated sites only.
- 2. Display camping receipt and ParkPass as instructed.
- 3. Campers under 18 must be accompanied by an adult.
- 4. Quiet hours are 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
- 5. Check-out is 12:00 p.m. and check-in time is 1:00 p.m. Please re-register if necessary by 12:00 p.m. Office hours are 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. daily.
- 6. Maximum occupancy 6 persons, 1 camper and 1 pup tent or 2 tents per site.
- 7. Campground host at sites #1, #38, Walk-ins and area of Cottages 5-17.
- 8. No dishwashing in comfort station. Dispose of grey water at the dump station or grey water dump site.
- 9. Trash bins are provided at the dump stations in campgrounds 1 and 2.
- 10. Swimming allowed only at beach.
- 11. Fireworks and other explosives prohibited. Firearms permitted only with Firearms License from Georgia or reciprocating states.
- 12. Alcoholic beverages inside your camping unit only. Public intoxication will result in arrest.
- 13. Violations can result in eviction from the park or arrest.
