### BIRDS AND BEES (AND BEARS, OH MY!) Saturday, February 11th 4pm-6pm

Forget the red roses, heart-shaped chocolates and sappy cards! Come learn about the love languages and courtship rituals of some of our native animals. From the endearing, to the mildly alarming, to the downright strange, nature covers it all. Non-alcoholic drinks and light hors d'oeuvres will be served. Please note because of the nature of this program, this is for participants 21 years old and up. Cost is \$10 per participant.



### IT'S NOT EASY BEING GREEN Saturday, March 18th 10am-12:00pm Program, Lunch, 1pm-3pm Workday

Is your garden full of invasive species? You may not know that some of your favorite ornamental and display species are not advisable to plant. They can easily take over an area or may harm another species. Learn about different types of common garden plants that can be detrimental to your local ecosystem. Come for the program, bring a lunch to eat, then help staff with invasive species removal around the Visitor Center.



### **PLANTING NATIVES FOR POLLINATORS** Saturday, April 15th 9am-11am

Interested in having a yard or garden that requires less maintenance than traditional landscaping? Maybe you want to attract some of Georgia's beautiful butterflies, hummingbirds, or bumblebees? Come learn about some native plants you can add to your yard that are better adapted to survive in the Piedmont Region's unique climate and soil, along with helping to support your local pollinators. At the end of the class you will also get to take home some native plants seeds for your yard!



# **KEEPING GA WILD DAY** Saturday, May 20th 9am-2pm

Participants can try their hand at archery, fishing, shooting sports, and other outdoor recreation activities.
