WHERE THE WILD THINGS ARE (AGES 6-8) \$150

June 6-10 Brooke Ager Discovery Area

Day Camp, 9:00 am - 4:00 pm each day

"Let the wild rumpus start!" Inspiring a love of nature and the outdoors, this camp opens the door to a lifetime of adventure and fun through exploration and hands-on activities. Using play, crafts, live animal encounters, and games campers escape to the natural world to have amazing adventures each day. During this camp, campers will get a chance to tell their own "WILD" story of where the wild things are.

NATURE HEROES DAY CAMP (AGES 8-10) \$150

SHOOTING SPORTS CAMP (AGES 12–16) \$275

June 27 - July 1 Charlie Elliott Conference Center
Overnight Camp, Monday 9:00 am - Friday 1:00 pm

Shooting Sports Camp will get your camper started on the path to becoming a responsible shooter by exposing them to various types of firearms and always emphasizing safety. Campers will learn fundamentals and proper handling of rifles, shotguns and archery equipment; participate in shooting activities; and practice safety. By the end of the week, campers will have completed the National Rifle Association's (NRA) First Steps program.

GONE FISHIN' (AGES 11–13) \$215

While the parents are away, the kids will fish all day! This camp is designed for the young angler to master knot tying, casting, and retrieval. We will dive into fisheries management, explore fish biology, and of course, have plenty of time for fishing.

OUT HUNTIN' (AGES 12–16) \$275

Overnight Camp, Monday 9:00 am - Friday 1:00 pm

Interested in becoming a hunter but unsure of how to get started? Participants will learn basic wildlife biology and behavior; how to pursue, harvest and process Georgia's game species; hunter safety practices; and firearms handling. By week's end, participants will have completed Georgia's hunter safety certification requirements. Campers will also have an opportunity to demonstrate the new skills and knowledge learned.

ACE (ADVENTURES IN CONSERVATION EDUCATION (RISING 6TH–8TH GRADE) \$175

Overnight Camp, Monday 9:00 am - Friday 5:00 pm

ACE is a unique camp for middle school students focusing on wildlife conservation. Participants will spend five days immersed in Georgia wildlife via hands-on activities and day trips in the lower coastal plain including trips to Jekyll Island, Sapelo Island, and Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge. Thanks to a grant from The Environmental Resources Network, the cost of this camp is only \$175 per person.
