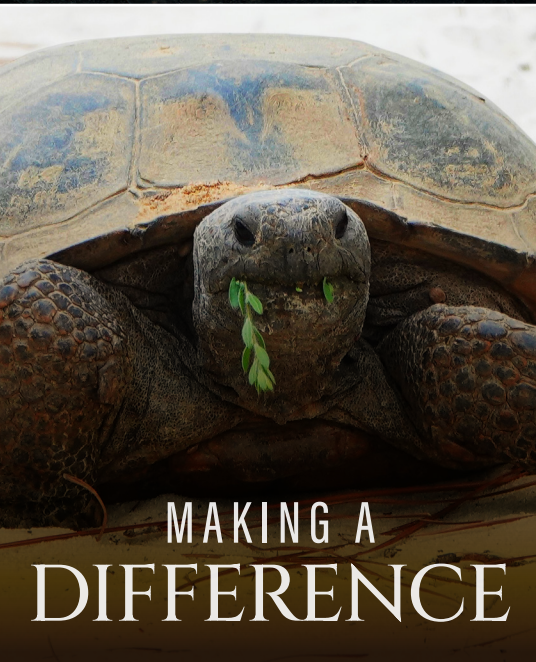

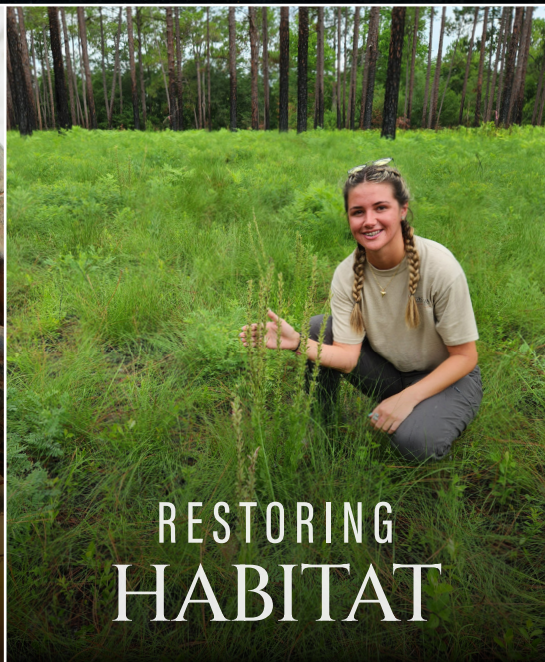

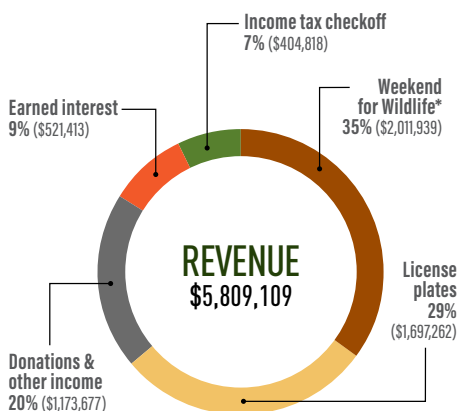
# 2025 HIGHLIGHTS

- ✔ Helped achieve a Gopher Tortoise Conservation Initiative milestone: 65 populations permanently protected!
- ✔ Led completion of Georgia's 2025 State Wildlife Action, which will guide conservation for the next 10 years.
- ✔ Added Upatoi Ravines Natural Area and Treat Mountain WMA with key support from a Georgia DOT agreement aiding bats and needed roadwork.
- ✔ Rallied on private and public lands to restore wildlife habitat in the wake of Hurricane Helene.
- ✔ Opened the Joe Tanner Discovery Center at Charlie Elliott Wildlife Center, part of larger education efforts that reached over 100,000 people this year.
- ✔ Advanced plant conservation across the state, helping with easements benefiting endangered Canby's dropwort, relocating at-risk pitcherplants and documenting unique species.
- ✔ Teamed with northwest Georgia partners to assess threatened trispot darters using eDNA and identify culverts that block their spawning runs.
- ✔ Monitored and studied imperiled mammals, from North Atlantic right whales to Appalachian cottontails.
- ✔ As keeper of the Biotics database and DNR's 1,600-profiles-plus Biodiversity Portal, served as our state's go-to source on rare wildlife.
- ✔ Promoted a red knot's stunning migration and capped a Georgia coastwide survey of fast-declining saltmarsh sparrows.



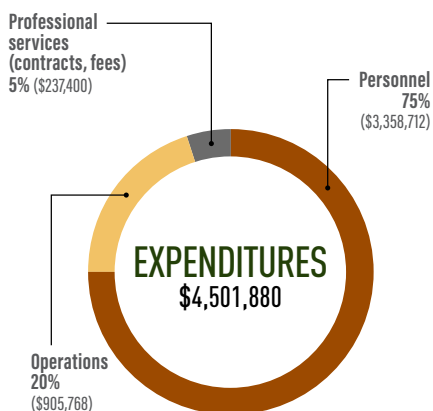

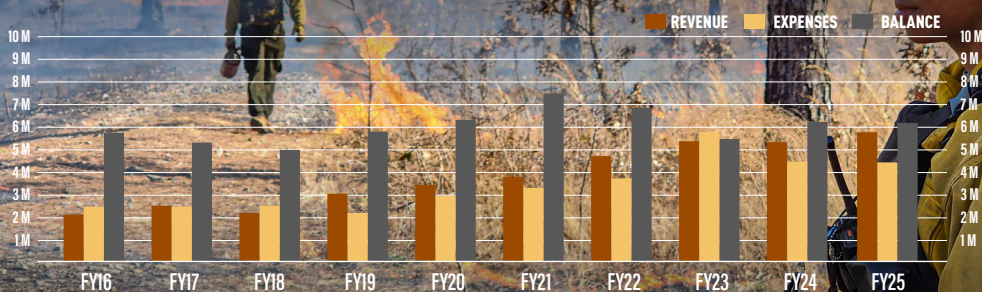
\*2025 Weekend for Wildlife revenue disbursed by the Georgia Natural Resources Foundation in fiscal 2026.

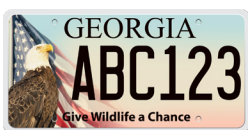
