Physical Activity Ratings:

Classes below are described according to the level of physical activity required to participate fully. This classification is to help you decide if the class is right for you. If you are not sure, just ask us for more information. We're happy to help!

LEISURELY (L): Class is not physically demanding.

MODERATE (M): Class requires moderate level of physical activity; for example, lifting an 8-pound chainsaw, shotgun, paddling a canoe or kayak.

RUGGED (R): Class is strenuous and may require hiking/climbing over uneven terrain.

Explore the park in 3 hours in 3 different ways! You'll first tour the natural ecosystem of the swamp on a boat, then have time for lunch before boarding a train for a historical tour. The final part of your experience is a reptile show with the park staff. There will be a break for lunch where you can bring your own or purchase it on site and there is a nature center to visit. If you'd like overnight accommodations Laura Walker State Park has cabins or there are local hotels available.
