Critter Classics

Animals come in many different forms. How do we separate them? Through lessons, games, and activities, students will learn the basics of classification and demonstrate how to group animals together based on their observed similarities and differences.

Splendidly Spineless

No backbone? No problem! Students will explore adaptations in invertebrates that set them apart from other groups of animals and make them splendidly skilled survivalists in their habits.

Mammalian Marvels

There are over 90 species of wild mammals in Georgia! Students will discover some of the characteristics that help us define mammals and the marvelous adaptations that help them thrive in various habitats.

Brilliant Birds

Feathers and beaks are just a couple of the brilliant features we see in birds, what other adaptations set them apart? Students will learn about differences among our feathered friends and how different birds meet their basic needs.

Astonishing Amphibians

Georgia is the second-most diverse state for amphibians, boasting over 85 different species! Students will investigate the astonishing traits of amphibians that make them so unique.

Remarkable Reptiles

If their scales could tell tales, we would have a lot to learn from the reptiles of Georgia. Students will delve into the remarkable world of reptiles to learn how their features help them live their day-to-day.

Fantastic Fish

Georgia ranks third in freshwater fish diversity with an amazing 305 species recorded! Students will analyze the fin-tastic characteristics of fish that distinguish them from other vertebrate groups.
