- Call 1-800-366-2661. Must use credit card for payment.
- Mail in the completed VESSEL REGISTRATION APPLICATION and payment.
 1. Complete all spaces on the VESSEL REGISTRATION APPLICATION.
 2. Write the payment amount in the box provided at the bottom of the Fee Table.
 3. No cash. Make checks and money orders payable to GEORGIA DNR.
 4. BE SURE TO SIGN YOUR REGISTRATION APPLICATION.

NEW Vessel Registration – BRAND NEW BOAT	Copy of Bill of Sale/Receipt from dealer and original Manufacturer's Statement of Origin.
TRANSFER of Ownership for a GA Registered Vessel – vessel is USED with an existing GA registration. TEMPORARY CERTIFICATE / AUTHORIZATION NUMBER issued at payment is valid for 60 days and may be used in GA, but only if the vessel has a valid Hull Identification Number (HIN) or is exempt from HIN requirements because it is a 1972 or older vessel. **IMPORTANT:** To Use Temporary Registration, applicant(s) must KEEP A COPY of completed application & A COPY OF PAYMENT while the boat is being operated (if mailed), have a copy of the online renewal receipt (if done online), or have a temporary authorization # in possession (telephone).

O.C.G.A. § 52-7-72.1: Any vessel owner that has registered such vessel with the Department of Natural Resources that fails to remove such vessel from public waters or public property within 30 days receipt of the notice issued pursuant to subsection (b) of this Code section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated nature and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$5,000.00 or by confinement for a term not to exceed 12 months, or both; provided, however, that the requirement for removal of a vessel within 30 days pursuant to this subsection shall be inapplicable within 36 months of a declaration by the Governor of a state of emergency due to a natural disaster affecting the location of the vessel. Upon a second or subsequent offense for failure to remove an abandoned vessel from public waters or public property, a vessel owner that has registered such vessel with the Department of Natural Resources shall be guilty of a felony and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$50,000.00 or by imprisonment for a term not to exceed five years, or both. In addition to any other penalty authorized by law for failure to remove an abandoned vessel from public waters or public property, the court may order a person convicted pursuant to this subsection to make restitution to Department of Natural Resources for the reasonable costs or damages associated with failure to remove the vessel, including the cost of removal, storage, and disposal of such vessel. Restitution made pursuant to this subsection shall not preclude the Department of Natural Resources from obtaining any other civil or criminal remedy available under any other provision of law. The restitution authorized by this Code section shall be supplemental and not exclusive.
